## Agenda Item Wording:

Discussion and possible action to approve the allocation of \$45,095,92 from the Open Space Contingency Reserve Fund for capital improvements to resurface the Richmond Playground basketball courts.

### Background / Description:

Richmond Playground is a .82-acre park located between 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> Avenues near Lake St. in supervisorial District 1. The park consists of a playground, a tennis court, two basketball courts, a multi-purpose court and clubhouse. The basketball courts are in poor condition and are in need of resurface repair and new basketball backstops.

Recreation and Park staff conducted a site visit to review the extent of damage and needed repairs. Staff found a crack spanning the width of the courts and several other fissures. In addition, the backboards of the basketball hoops were in poor condition.

The following items are included in the scope of work:

- Resurface and repair basketball courts
- Clean and provide crack filler and fabric
- Restripe courts
- Replace 4 basketball hoops and backboards

The estimated total project cost is:

Construction: \$38,186.59

JOC Fee: \$1,909.33

Project Management: \$5,000

Total: \$45,095.92
