Scheduled Workshops

March / 10-12pm on Saturdays with Michelle Chan/Monsters and Robots




March 10 Cardboard Robots: Create your own robots out of recycled boxes and plastic juice containers. Learn how to be eco-friendly and creative at the same time!

March 17 Paper Bots: Students will be able to construct their own robot from scratch! By building and putting together a paper robot, students get to decorate to match their individual styles.

March 24 Monster Pals: Learn how to create a new fuzzy monster friend out of yarn.

March 31 Monsters & Robot Sticker Making: Learn how to draw monsters and robots and create your very own monster and robot stickers to share with family and friends!

April 20 Marionettes: Students will be given dowels (with tiny eye hooks already screwed in) precut for specific body parts and will then use their air dry clay to mold around the dowels to form the marionette. Once the body parts are painted, students will string them together for some playful interaction.

April 28 Recyclable Flowers: Students will first use sharpies to trace flower patterns onto plastic water bottles and egg cartons. As the workshop progresses, students cut out and paint them with colorful tissue and adhere with glue.

May 5 Sunflowers: Students will design and paint a scene involving the motif of sunflowers. Using traditional painting as a point of departure, students will explore how to simplify complex shapes, and forms.



May 12 Butterflies: Butterflies are beautiful and majestic creatures. Their elegant wings show off a variety of colors and designs. Students will sketch out the butterfly and learn how to use watercolors to layer the basic shades and textures of butterfly wings.

May 19 Dragons: Dragons have a long history in art from cultures around the world. Students will create their own dragon painting with watercolor paints and simple techniques.
