

RICHMOND OFFICERS APPREHEND SUSPECT ON BICYCLE... AGAIN. MLK JR DRIVE & CHAIN OF LAKES DR 05/10/2017 5:57 AM

In a repeat of last week's incident, a suspect riding a bicycle attempted to outrun officers from Richmond Station in a patrol vehicle. Once again, the officers were able to apprehend the suspect. The officers observed a traffic violation performed by a

bicyclist and attempted to stop the bicycle and issue the rider a citation. The suspect thought he would try his luck, ficers searched the suspect's and attempted to evade the officers on his bicycle. Unfortunately for the suspect, his luck ran out when he fell into the bushes inside Golden Gate Park

The officers were able to detain the suspect without further incident. They ran a criminal history check on the suspect and discovered that

he had an outstanding warrant for his arrest for possessing burglary tools. When the ofbelongings, they located bolt cutters, pliers, and other tools commonly used by burglary suspects.

The suspect was booked at San Francisco County Jail for his warrant, resisting arrest, and a brand new charge of possessing burglary tools.

### TWO SUSPECTS ARRESTED AFTER ASSAULT IN GOLDEN **GATE PARK FULTON STREET & LA**

PLAYA STREET 5/14/2017 4·50 PM

Richmond District officers responded to the area of Golden Gate Park, behind the Beach Chalet, regarding an assault. Upon their arrival, they located two male subjects who appeared to have been in an altercation. One of the subjects claimed they had been punched by a third person, but said he did not need any police assistance.

The other subject who was

involved in the altercation was located in the Safeway parking lot. This subject, who had multiple injuries to his face and head, claimed he had been assaulted by two suspects. He told the officers that an acquaintance of his was engaging in drug dealing activity. He claimed that when he attempted to stop the illegal activity, his acquaintance and the 'customer' both began to punch him repeatedly.

After a thorough investigation, it was determined that the subject with the injuries was the victim in the incident. The victim positively identified his assailants, and

they were placed under arrest. A search of one of the suspects revealed an illegal pellet gun in his pocket. The suspects also had a dog with them, and nobody to take care of it Animal Care and Control responded to take custody of the dog.

Both suspects were booked into San Francisco County Jail.

### **SUSPECT TRIES TO** STEAL BAG FROM A **CHILD**

An 11 year old child was walking home from school when he was approached by an unknown suspect. The cowardly suspect, who was described as a 30-35 year old man, demanded that the child give him his wallet. When the child refused, the suspect hit him on the shoulder and used a disgusting racial slur. The victim ran back to school to report the incident.

Officers from Richmond Station responded and took a police report. The suspect was described as a "skinny" Asian male, approximately 5'6" tall

with black hair. He was last seen wearing baggy khaki pants and a brown flannel long sleeve shirt.

Investigators at Richmond Station are working to identify the suspect, and we expect an arrest to me made in the near future.

### LOCAL PHARMACY ROBBED BY KNIFE-YIELDING SUSPECT **GEARY BOULEVARD &** PALM AVENUE 5/11/2017 8:40 PM

When an employee at a local pharmacy heard items being dropped on the floor inside the store, he went to see exactly what was happening. What he found was a suspect placing multiple bottles of body wash into a paper bag. Believing that the suspect was going to leave the store without paying for the merchandise, he attempted to retrieve the property from the suspect. The suspect plainly stated that he was going to take the items, and attempted to leave the store. The employee grabbed the bag from the suspect before he could leave, and the bag and merchandise fell to the floor. The suspect fled the scene without the merchandise.

A short time later, the suspect returned to the pharmacy to try his luck again. He tried again to grab the bottles of body wash, which were still at the counter. The employee 220 lbs. He was last seen again confronted the suspect, who fled the scene a second time without the merchandise

After the suspect had left the store, a knife was found by the entrance. The employee reviewed the video surveillance and saw that the suspect had been holding the

knife when he entered the store the second time. Realizing they could have potentially been injured, the employee called for police to respond to the scene.

The suspect in this incident is described as a black male between 30 and 40 years of age. He is approximately 6'2" tall and weighs approximately wearing a white T-shirt, gray sweatpants, and black shoes.


This incident is still under investigation by the Richmond Station Investigations Team. Hopefully the suspect will soon be identified and arrested.

Officer Ivanov's Tip of the Week:



#### Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on May 4th, 8th, 16th and 26th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: excessive and unsafe speed, unsafe turns, failure to stop for signs and signals, failure to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets by 2024 as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these nonmotorized means of transportation. In 2013, California witnessed 701 pedestrians and 141 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.



The San Francisco Police Department will be conducting Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations this month. The operations will target the 'Focus on the 5' violations:


- Speeding
- Red light violations
- Stop sign violations
- Failing to yield to oncoming traffic when turning left
- Failing to yield to a pedestrian

They will also emphasize bicycle and pedestrian safety.

The goal is to achieve Vision Zero SF - eliminating traffic deaths by the year 2024.
