Traffic Stop Leads to DUI Investigation and Arrest <i>Geary Blvd & 10th Ave</i> <i>09/08/17 1:50 AM</i> On September 8 th at 1:50 AM, Richmond Station Patrol Offi- cers were driving in the area of 9th Avenue and Geary Blvd performing traffic enforcement. Officers observed a Lexus with orange tinted headlights. The Lexus also failed to come to a stop behind the limit line at the	solid red light at the intersection of 10th Ave & Geary Blvd. The Officers quickly conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. Upon contact with the driver, Officers observed signs of in- toxication, along with the smell of alcohol coming from the driver. The driver was asked to perform Field Sobriety Tests. The driver then agreed to perform the	breathalyzer test and it was re- vealed that he was 1.5 times over the legal limit. The driver was arrested and transported to County Jail for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol along with minor traf- fic infractions. *All suspects are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
License Plate Reader on Patrol Vehicle Leads to Sto- len Vehicle- Arrest Great Hwy & Fulton St 09/06//2017 11:38 AM Richmond Station Patrol Offi- cers were patrolling in the area of the Cliff House with the use of License Plate Reader Tech- nology affixed to the roof of the Patrol Vehicle. While driving the Officers were alerted to a	stolen vehicle that was travel- ling in the opposite direction. The Officers quickly got behind the vehicle and performed a high risk felony vehicle stop at the intersection of Great Hwy and Fulton Street. The vehicle was occupied by two males who were quickly placed in hand- cuffs by Officers. The driver had a suspended li- cense and claimed to have no knowledge of the vehicle being	stolen. The passenger eventually admitted to stealing the car. The driver was issued a citation for driving with a suspended license and released while the passenger was arrested for pos- session of a stolen vehicle along with stealing the vehicle. *All suspects are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
Traffic Collision Leads to DUI Arrest <i>19th Ave & Fulton St</i> <i>09/09/17 11:20 PM</i> On September 9th, 2017 at 11:20 PM, Richmond Station Patrol Officers were notified about a vehicle collision with possible injuries. Upon arrival Officers conducted an interview	of the driver of one vehicle the vehicle showing signs of being intoxicated. The driver per- formed the Field Sobriety Tests and elected to have a blood draw instead of the breath test. The driver was subsequently taken to the hospital for medical evaluation and later booked at County Jail for Driving While	Under the Influence of Alcohol. *All suspects are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.








