# CAPTAIN'S MESSAGE:

Officer Lee from Richmond Station along with Supervisor Sandra Fewer, recently attended a community meeting at Kawikas Deli, regarding public safety concerns that the community had. Below are some of the highlights of the meeting:

Many people expressed their concerns about the growing number of homelessness around La Playa. Officers have been briefed about the situation and will increase passing calls in the area. Richmond Station also has homeless outreach Officers who will address the area and attempt to encourage individuals to seek services and city resources.

Residents expressed concern about vehicles speeding through different areas of the Richmond District, especially in Golden Gate Park. Supervisor Fewer indicated that she was working with DPW to increase lighting within the area and to conduct a traffic study within the park. Supervisor Fewer also mentioned that Richmond Station and her office will be offering a driver re-education or refresher course in hopes of making the streets safer for vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists.

Residents were happy to see Police Officers at 850 La Playa, and expressed their appreciation for the Officers. Residents stated they have seen an enormous difference and hoped they would see more Officers in the future.

One of the biggest concern was the increase in property crimes within the district. Richmond Station recently launched a plainclothes unit, increased the number of foot beats for crime ridden areas and is in collaboration with the SFDA's office in solving, and reducing these types of crimes. # DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

**Examples of Suspicious Activity:** 

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

# **DEFINITION OF COMMUNITY POLICING**

Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

**Homeless Outreach:** Richmond Station Officers coordinate with city agencies to provide assistance and offer City services as needed. The Officers handle quality of life issues and find programs for willing individuals.

**Foot Patrol:** Richmond Station has dedicated foot patrols on Clement St., Geary Blvd, Golden Gate Park as well as the Cliff House.

**Richmond Station Community Meetings:** Community Meetings are held once a month for the public and residents of the Richmond District to attend. People can voice their comments or concerns about issues in the Richmond District.



# Definitions

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

\*\*<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\*

**Aggravated Assault**– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.


**Burglary**– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft**– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

The suspect was booked for the warrant, as well as 4.10 PC for consuming alcohol in a park.










The above pie chart represents the time of day auto boosts occur.



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



# What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

#### Three Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

After clearing a basic background check you will be eligible to register for one of our triannual ALERT training classes as follows:

- 1. Complete two 8 hour classes with ALERT, or,
- 2. If you are already NERT Certified, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT, or,
- 3. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT.

#### San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Central District Homicide

On February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at 6:38 PM San Francisco Police officers responded to 500 block of Post Street in the Central district regarding an unresponsive male in a wheelchair. Upon arrival, the officers found the victim, 31 year-old Andrew Emmett of San Francisco, suffering from numerous cuts and bruises. San Francisco Fire Department paramedics responded and attempted to render aid, but unfortunately Emmett had already succumbed to his injuries.

SFPD Homicide Investigators began an investigation that led to the identification of several suspects. On February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at approximately 2:00 PM, SFPD and Petaluma Police Department officers served search warrants on the 100 block of Marshall Avenue in Petaluma, CA. Based on the information obtained during the investigation, the following suspects were arrested:

Christopher Hardee, 47 years old, Petaluma resident, booked into San Francisco County Jail on charges of homicide, robbery, burglary, and conspiracy.

Nicole Hardee, 40 years old, Petaluma resident, booked into San Francisco County Jail on charges of homicide, robbery, burglary, and conspiracy.

Kayleb Hardee, 21 years old, Petaluma resident, booked in absentia on charges of homicide, robbery, burglary, and conspiracy.

Due to pending identification matters, the suspects' booking photos will not be released at this time.

Although arrests have been made, investigators are asking anyone with information on this case to contact the San Francisco Police tip line at 415-575-4444 or text-a-tip to TIP411 with SFPD at the start of the message. You may do so anonymously.

#### Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on February 13th, 20th, 23rd and 28th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these nonmotorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

#### San Francisco Police Safety Tips for Lunar New Year Festivities

Gung Hay Fat Choy! The 2018 San Francisco Chinese New Year Parade will be held on **Saturday, February 24, 2018**. The parade, begun in the 1860's as a means to educate the community about Chinese culture, is the largest such lunar year celebration in the country and one of San Francisco's most popular and well-attended events.

With huge crowds expected, including guests from all over the world, public safety is the San Francisco Police Department's number one priority. There will be a significant police presence during Lunar New Year activities, with both uniformed and plainclothes officers on duty to monitor public events. As with any large event, safety is everyone's responsibility, including participants, organizers, security staff and law enforcement.

Lunar New Year celebrants can help avoid becoming a victim of a crime by keeping in mind the following safety tips:

- The festivities are about celebrating community. Look out for each other and report any suspicious persons or activity to event staff or a police officer. A good adage is, "If you see something, say something." In an emergency, call 9-1-1. To provide an anonymous tip, call the SFPD Anonymous Tip Line at (415) 575-4444.
- Stay informed by signing up for emergency text message alerts by texting the word AlertSF to 888-777. AlertSF allows us to notify you of emergencies in San Francisco.

#### Types of Crime Reports That Can Be Filed Online:

- Harassing Phone Calls: When you are experiencing annoying calls with no known suspects; for example, hang-ups or heavy breathing.
- Lost Property: When property has disappeared and not stolen. If you think it could have been taken but you have no idea by who, you may enter the report online.
- Theft: When property is stolen but there has been no illegal entry or contact by the thief.
- Vandalism/Graffiti: The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property, including graffiti.
- Vehicle Burglary: When property was stolen from a vehicle.
- Vehicle Tampering: Tampering with a motor vehicle, including vandalism/graffiti of the vehicle.

# **Calling the Police:**

# Dispatchers ask questions in a particular order for a reason. It is best to stay calm and answer all questions to the best of your ability.

Complaint: Location, Hazards (ie. weapons at scene), Victim info (sex, age, condition) Suspect Description: Gender, Race, Age, Clothing, distinguishing features Vehicle Description: Color, Make, Model, License Plate, distinguishing features
